

What's at stake in this election

his Voters' Guide provides information on hundreds of candidates running for office on Nov. 7. With so much at stake, this is one election not to sit out. It is a matter of life and death for the lgbt community and the outcome will greatly impact the quality of our family life in the years ahead.

The Nov. 7 elections are perhaps the most important in the history of lgbt rights. Candidates at all levels of government are aware of the power of the lgbt vote. Political pundits argue that control of the White House and Congress could depend on what happens in five key urban, industrialized states: Illinois, Michigan, New Jersey, Ohio and Pennsylvania. Each of these states has two things in common - the two major parties are in close competition, and the lgbt electorate is potentially huge in affecting the outcome of this election in these states.

In Michigan, the National Gay and Lesbian Task Force estimates that the gay and lesbian vote is about 169,000. That is larger than the presidential margin of victory in 1960 (66,841 votes) and approaches the margin of victory in 1976 (197,000 votes). In Michigan we have the opportunity to make a difference at all levels of government by voting for candidates that support lgbt issues.

Candidates have articulated their positions on the issues important to lgbt people, such as hate crimes legislation, employment non-discrimination, adoption and child custody rights, same-sex marriage, immigration and HIV/AIDS funding. They are seeking our vote, or the votes of our enemies, depending on their positions on the issues.

In the presidential election, Vice President Al Gore supports the Employment Non-Discrimination Act, he has vowed to sign hate crime legislation, he supports same-sex unions, and has said he would welcome an openly-gay person into his cabinet. Texas Gov. George W. Bush said he would veto hate-crimes legislation, does not support ENDA, opposes any legal recognition of same-sex partnerships and has flip-flopped on whether openly gay appointments will occur if he is elected. The next president is likely to appoint at least two and perhaps as many as four judges to the U.S. Supreme Court.

In the United States Senate race, Michigan has a chance to elect Debbie Stabenow, someone who has demonstrated unwavering support on lgbt issues for over a decade. She has a 91 percent positive lgbt voting record from the HRC, compared to a dismal zero percent ranking of the incumbent Republican Senator Spencer Abraham.

The Michigan House of Representatives is up for reelection. Currently controlled by Republicans, the Michigan legislature has not allowed any pro-lgbt legislation out of committee for the entire last twoyear session. If the House is returned to Democratic control, we can expect to see votes on hate crime legislation, and we can expect that the legislature will be less likely to pass anti-lgbt legislation, such as the bill proposed by a conservative group of freshman Republicans in this session that would have penalized any state university that offered a course that portrays lgbt people as productive, important members of our American society.

We encourage readers to take this guide to the polls on voting day and use it. It matters. Come out and vote Nov. 7.

Spencer Abraham voted against the legislation in the Senate. He is being challenged by Debbie Stabenow who strongly supports it. Elizabeth Birch, executive director of the Human Rights Campaign, comforted her as Shepard spoke about the death



James Dale was ousted from the Boy Scouts of America after it was discovered he is gay. He sued the BSA for discriminating against him, but ultimately lost his case on appeal to the United States Supreme Court by a 5 to 4 decision. The next U.S. president is expected to appoint at least two, and perhaps as many as four justices to the Supreme Court. George W. Bush has said his two favorite justices are Clarence Thomas and Antonin Scalia, the two most conservative members of the current court.



'The Vermont Three" won their case before the Vermont Supreme Court. which ruled that same-sex couples deserve all the same rights as married couples. In Michigan, the Supreme Court is currently dominated by conservative justices. 



On the following eight pages, you will find voting recommendations and endorsements in hundreds of races, organized by the 16 congressional districts. Just go to your district's section and you will find information on races that will be on your ballot, including your U.S. Congressperson, state senator, state representative, judges, and ballot initiatives. Clip it out and take it to the polls with you.

Pro-Gay Endorsements

BTL - Between The Lines newspaper

etween The Lines, the award-Dwinning statewide lgbt newspaper in Michigan, made its endorsements based on its own research, which included polling by BTL, reviewing voting records and biographies of the candidates, and information, advice and endorsements from Pride-PAC, LAHR-PAC and other political organizations. It also studied the endorsements of anti-gay organizations to determine which candidates would be particularly unfriendly to the lettermine munity. BTL trief to make recommendations in as many races as possible. In some cases, no candidate was found to be positive on lgbt issues. In many circumstances, BTL chose the candidate that is the least negative of the two.

HRC-PAC - Human Rights Campaign Political Action Committee

The Human Rights Campaign in Washington, D.C. is the nation's largest political organization fighting for the rights, health, safety and dignity of lgbt people. The HRC Political Action Committee supports candidates running for national office who support an end to anti-gay discrimination, more AIDS funding, women's health issues and are pro-choice. HRC-PAC makes its endorsements based on research and experience with individual members of Congress. They also rate the voting records of members of congress, with 100 percent as the best possible voting record on lgbt issues. Call HRC at (202) 628-4160 or visit the website at www.hrusa.org.

Pride-PAC - Pride Political Action Committee

Pride-PAC is a registered Political Action Committee that endorses candidates at the federal, state and local levels. Pride-PAC bases its endorsements on candidate responses to written surveys, candidate interviews and other research including voting records, media interviews and the candidates, positions intikely issues laborancems. Pride-PAC can be reached at (313) 962-1777.

LAHR-PAC - Lansing Area Human Rights Political Action Committee

The Lansing for Human Rights Political Action Committee mailed questionnaires to approximately 100 Michigan candidates running for office. In addition, LAHR-PAC shared information with other organizations, including Pride-PAC of Michigan and the National Organization for Women. The ratings of LAHR-PAC are based on personal telephone calls, candidates' voting records, public statements, and other information. Call them at (517) 332-3200.

MEA-PAC - Michigan Education Association and National Education Association Political Action Committee

The National Education Association is the largest union of teachers in the country. The Michigan Education Association represents teachers in most of the school districts in Michigan except those in Southeastern Michigan, who are represented by the American Federation of Teachers. The MEA has a policy of nondiscrimination on the basis of sexual orientation. The MEA-PAC endorsements are not based on any specific criteria regarding lgbt issues. Contact them at (517) 332-6551.

Political Indicators and Voting Records

Liberal/Conservative Rating - Inside Michigan Politics

"Inside Michigan Politics" newsletter, published by political pundit Bill Ballenger, comes out 24 times per year by subscription. In September, IMP studied the roll calls on 30 bills introduced into the Michigan House of Representatives in which a clear liberal or conservative position could be determined. IMP then rated legislators using a spectrum where a 100 percent rating indicates someone who voted the "liberal" position in all votes on a wide variety of economic, taxation, social/cultural, environmen-

tal, civil rights and law enforcement issues. Ballenger is a former Michigan State Representative and State Senator, an ex-state racing commissioner, and director of the Michigan Department of Licensing and Regulation. Ballenger also served as Deputy Assistant Secretary of the U.S. Department of Health, Education and Welfare in the administration of President Gerald R. Ford. Federal Legislation

We looked at whether Michigan's congressional representative co-sponsored two bilts important to the lebt community, the ent Non-Disci mination Act and the Hate Crimes Prevention Act. In all cases

except two, representatives either co-sponsored both bills or neither of them. In the 1st District Bart, Stupak did not co-sponsor ENDA but did so-sponsor the HCPA. In the 16th street, with Dingel split his so-sponsorship in the same way.

Michigan Legislation

In early 2000, a controversy arose over a course offered by professor David Halperin at the University of Michigan titled "How to be Gay." It prompted a group of conservative House members to offer an amendment to the 2000 state university appropriations bill that would have penalized any state-funded university by 10 percent of their total budget if it offered any course in which "the content

may be interpreted as promoting or facilitating the participation in a sexual lifestyle or practices other than heterosexual monogamy." The bill failed, thankfully. We looked at the voting records of the members of the Michigan House. A Yes vote means they voted to penalize a university for offering such a course. A No vote means they voted against the legislation.

Anti-gay Endorsements

It is important to understand which candidates are endorsed by anti-lgbt groups because it gives us an indication as to how these candidates would vote on lgbt issues should they get into office. We offer here the endorsements of two groups that generally ally themselves with politicians who are unfriendly to lgbt issues.

Right to Life of Michigan-PAC

The political arm of the Right to Life of Michigan, and is committed to electing a strong pro-life majority in the Michigan Legislature. The RLM-PAC uses financial support from RLM members to help elect pro-life candidates. According to a RLM spokesperson, RLM-PAC has no formal position on lgbt rights. Endorsements are based on candidate research, personal

interviews, and the particular circumstances of each race.

CTV-PAC - Citizens for Traditional Values Political Action Committee

The Citizens for Traditional Values is a political action committee related to the taxexempt Foundation for Traditional Values educational group. CTV headquarters are located just north of Lansing. "CTV is the most secretive and perhaps the most extreme of the Religious Right groups in this state," wrote Russ Bellant in his book "The Religious Right in Michigan Politics," published by the Americans for Religious Liberty. The CTV-PAC takes a very strong anti-gay stance and has advocated against repeal of the sodomy statues, against the parental rights of lgbt people, for penalizing universities that offer domestic partner benefits, and against gays in the military. CTV spearheaded the national campaign against gay marriage.


